# 438. PENHWCH FARM, PWLL - PROPOSAL TO DIVERT REGISTERED PUBLIC FOOTPATH 57/85 & 86

Members were circulated with correspondence received from the Countryside Access Assistant, Carmarthenshire County Council informing of an application to divert the above mentioned public footpath. The proposed diversion would move sections of footpath 57/85 and 57/86 from the present alignment through the farmyard Penhwch Farm, Pwll onto a new alignment through grassed areas and woodland.

**RESOLVED** that no objection be made to the application.

#### 439. THE PLANNING WALES ACT 2015

Members received correspondence from the Head of Service, The Planning Inspectorate stating that The Planning Wales Act 2015 introduced a new type of development, Developments of National Significance (DNS). Decisions on planning applications for DNS would be made by the Welsh Government, not the local planning authority.

The Planning Wales Act 2015 (Section 62Q) amended Schedule 1A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to require Welsh Ministers to notify the Council for a community or group of communities of an application for a DNS in its area if requested to do so.

The Clerk had completed the registration request for the Council to be notified of any DNS applications made in its area.
