84. FOOTPATH MAINTENANCE PROGRAMME

Further to Minute No. 50, the Chairman welcomed to the meeting Mr A Warner, Countryside Operations Manager and Mr N Powell, Countryside Recreation and Access Unit, Carmarthenshire County Council to discuss the footpath maintenance programme.

Carmarthenshire County Council was currently overhauling the entire management of footpath maintenance so that the level of grant support allocated to town and community councils was clearer and more equitable. Currently, the Rural Council received an annual

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grant amount from Carmarthenshire County Council to maintain public footpaths in its administrative area. Mr Warner explained that the County Council was changing the criteria for allocating grant payments. From now on it would like the Rural Council to prioritise ten footpaths in the community. He explained under the new scheme the Rural Council would maintain the ten footpaths by providing them with three cuts per year with the County Council paying a fixed rate per metre for the total meterage of three cuts. It would then be the decision of the Rural Council whether it still maintained the other routes in its area but no grant would be received from the County Council if this was the case.

Discussion followed about the ramifications of the scheme and the impact on the Rural Council's footpath maintenance budget. It was likely that the Council would receive less income from the County Council meaning there would be less money to offset total expenditure.

It was explained to Mr Warner that the Council had already set its budget for the current year based on receiving the same amount of grant received last year so from a point of reasonableness any changes contemplated should not take effect until the start of the next financial year (April 2016).

The Clerk explained that a further report would need to be presented to committee setting out options on the ten preferred nominated footpaths. This information would then be communicated to the County Council for consideration and in return it would then need to provide the Rural Council with the financial details of the new grant based on three cuts to the selected ten footpaths. This could then be considered when determining its budget for next year and it was

RESOLVED that:

- 1. Carmarthenshire County Council be requested not to introduce the new grant scheme for the time being because the Council had already set its budget. Furthermore, any changes to the Rural Council's grant allocation should be determined from 1 April, 2016.
- 2. A further committee report shall be presented for Members' consideration setting out details of the Council's footpath maintenance programme and the ten potential footpaths to be put forward to receive grant support with the information then being relayed to the County Council for appropriate consideration.
