Pre-application statement

Description of proposed scheme.

The current proposal is a much revised version of the Ponthenri/Pentremawr scheme which was submitted to Carmarthenshire County Council in 2008 and refused on 27th March 2014.

The site is located adjacent to Carnawllon-fawr farmstead midway between Pontyberem and Ponthenri, Carmarthenshire.

It is proposed to extract 210,000 tonnes of high quality anthracite over a 4.5 years period including 2.5 months site establishment/initial stripping, 46 months mining operations and phased restoration and 2.5 months final restoration.

The new scheme addresses the Council's reasons for refusing the Ponthenri/Pentremawr application refusal reasons primarily by full compliance with Welsh Government Planning Policy Guidance in MTAN2 which requires a 500 metres standoff from settlement boundaries for

mining operations; in the case the Ponthenri and Pontyberem settlement boundaries identified in the Carmarthenshire County Council Unitary Development Plan. (the previous scheme had included the dereliction associated with the former Pentremawr and Pont Henry collieries which lie within the MTAN2 500 metres standoffs.).

The new scheme also includes mining of the National Grid Gas ("NGG") pipeline corridor. Extensive discussions have taken place with NGG which is agreeable to mining of the pipeline corridor being included in the planning application. It is also noted that safeguarding of the gas pipeline is not a planning consideration but what exactly happens with respect to the pipeline will be determined in accordance with the Mining Code and the wayleave agreement between Draeth Developments Ltd and National Grid Gas.

An additional area has now been included between the gas pipeline and Carnawllon-fawr (as in the 2008 draft scheme). This could not be worked if the gas pipeline was retained but, for the purposes of the planning application, that constraint is no longer applicable. The site support area including anthracite washing plant, plant yard, offices and carparking will be located between Carnawllon-fawr and the new access road. Carnawllon-fawr farmhouse is under the control of the applicant and will not be occupied for the duration of the surface mine scheme.

The new scheme includes a new access road from the south direct onto the B4317 road and this has been designed to accommodate the required visibility splays etc.

Mining Operations.

Site establishment would commence with excavations to create the access road and haul road corridor into the site. The settlement lagoons and drainage discharge system and site support area would be established. Topsoil and soil making material from these areas and the western part of the site would be stored in overburden storage mounds TS1 and TS2 and S1. Overburden would be stored in T1 East and West.

Mining operations would commence in Cut B1 at the western end of the site with overburden being stored in remaining capacity in T1 East and West and T2 and T3. (see Drawing CF7).

Mining operations would the progress westwards with overburden stored in T4 as a surcharge over the backfilled initial excavation areas. (Drawing CF8.2). After completion of extraction at the eastern end of the site in Cut C18 (Drawing CF8.3) mining would transfer to Cut B1 west of the access road, progressing east into the final cut C19. Overburden from this area not required for backfilling of Cuts C17 and 18 would be stored in T5, a surcharge mound over earlier phase of mining and backfilling. At this

time, final restoration would also take place in the eastern part of the site (Drawing CF8.4).

Final backfilling of Cuts B1 and C19 would the take place followed by restoration of the site to final contours and placement of soils and soil making material.

Restoration would be to a mix of woodland, pasture, ponds and wetlands and with a new east-west multi user public access route looping southwards thereby creating a circular route together with the existing route alongside the old railway and enabling extensive views northwards across the Gwendraeth Fawr Valley from an area which is not currently accessible to the public.

Most of the unrestored old opencast high walls and open mine entrances towards the western end of the site have been included within the site boundary for reclamation purposes and would be suitably treated as part of the scheme.

Environmental Impact Assessment

With respect to environmental impact this will obviously be substantially less than the refused scheme given the greatly reduced area.

In terms of landscape and visual impact the retention of the large areas of woodland and scrub in the now excluded areas to the west and east will substantially reduce impacts.

Ecological impacts would also be significantly reduced given the exclusion of the areas referred to above.

Impacts on residential areas would be reduced substantially as the distance of site operations from these will be substantially increased. Careful consideration will, however, still need to be had in respect of individual properties to the south of the site.

Highways/transport was not a refusal reason in the original application and he new access point onto the public highway achieves the required

visibility distances and is much more straightforward in highway terms than the original access.

Likewise, archaeology was not a refusal reason in the original application and the original assessment will be revised in accord with the new site area.

Socio-economic impacts are now even more positive than when the original application was considered with employment and economic benefits being relatively more important in the uncertain times the country now faces and the shortage of UK produced anthracite for both UK and European industrial requirements in the steel, foundry, water purification and other industries requiring a high quality carbon product.
