# 181. SAFER ROUTES IN THE COMMUNITY DAFEN, LLANELLI

Members were circulated with correspondence from the Head of Transport and Engineering, Carmarthenshire County Council stating that the County Council had been successful in securing a Safer Routes in the Community Grant from the Welsh Assembly Government and it was proposed to introduce various road safety measures in the Dafen area.

The measures aimed to combat excessive and inappropriate speeds, especially in the vulnerable road user areas, such as outside schools, recreation areas, housing estates as well as enhancing general road safety by improving crossing points and build-outs at junctions.

General discussion ensued and the local members for the Dafen Ward questioned the need for a round top hump at 91 Tir Capel; they felt it wasn't necessary.

Furthermore, the footway improvements identified for the junction of New Road were also called into question. The local members felt the further narrowing of the junction point would exacerbate the current problem of access for buses and delivery lorries along a narrow stretch of road. They claimed the area in question was already a pinch point for delivery vehicles especially with other vehicle owners parking where they shouldn't! Narrowing the road by altering the pavement width would just add to the problem and would cause further access restrictions.

Members noted that the proposals had been formulated with every effort to take on board suggestions from the community. However, they felt that a number of issues and concerns raised previously through earlier stages of the consultation did not appear to have been addressed, and it was

#### **RESOLVED** that:

- (1) Members views on the proposed measures be forwarded to the Head of Transport and Engineering, Carmarthenshire County Council; and
- (2) a request be made to the County Council for a copy of the results of the previous community consultation exercise in order for a comparison to be made of the measures subsequently introduced having taken on board suggestions from the local community.
