Havelock Park Veterans Bowls Club was formed in 1984 and it's aims are as follows:-

- (a) the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation & socialising through the provision of facilities for playing bowls,
- (b) promote social inclusion with no restriction on age, sex, religion, culture,
- (c) encourage inter-generational activities to stimulate participation in the sport of bowls.

Havelock Park Veterans Bowls Club have approximately 30 registered members at present. The overall number of members has dwindled in recent years and the club is keen to attract more players. The club plays friendly matches (approx. 10 home and 10 away per year) and practise sessions at Calsonic Bowls Club in the Felinfoel ward. The Club are looking for financial support to help with running costs. The current subscriptions for players cannot be raised anymore or they will lose players and potentially fold as a club. Only players registered with other clubs in the competitive local league can play and have retired and be over 55years. The club is as much social interactivity as it is about bowls. Members enjoy meeting regularly either to play for or support the club. The matches away are very well attended however costly to run as we hire a coach for each away match. (in excess of £2000) Away games include Brecon, Troedyrhiw, Ebbw Vale, and Pendine.)


The Club was originally playing at Havelock Park but moved to play on Calsonic Bowls Club green as the future of playing at Havelock Park was in doubt.
