#### 471. LLANELLI CRICKET CLUB – MAINTENANCE WORKS

Members considered correspondence from the Chairman, Llanelli Cricket Club requesting maintenance support from the Council.

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The writer enquired whether the Council would maintain the outfield and surrounding area prior to and during the season to keep up the appearance of the grounds for the club.

Following discussion, it was

**RESOLVED** that the request be refused and that Llanelli Cricket Club be informed the Council has no spare capacity to offer assistance.

# 472. PROPOSED CYCLE ROUTE DAFEN HOSPITAL LINK

Cllrs. S. L. Davies, S. N. Lewis and A. J. Rogers all declared a personal and prejudicial interest in the following matter because they were members of Dafen Welfare Management Committee and left the meeting before discussion commenced.

Correspondence was received from the Highways and Transport Division, Carmarthenshire County Council informing of the proposed cycle route through Dafen park grounds.

The Clerk informed Members that the proposal would run adjacent to a small parcel of land which was used by the football club for training purposes. The cycle path linked Prince Philip Hospital grounds and the park to the main road.

The Clerk then commented on the proposal and made reference to the Council's current status in managing the park. The Council occupied the site under licence until such time as a formal lease could be completed with Carmarthenshire County Council. The upshot of this meant the Council was merely being informed about the proposal as the Council had no powers to object or prevent the scheme from proceeding. The Clerk then referred to emails about the proposal received from the bowls, cricket and football clubs operating out of the park and addressed how the points could be addressed or mitigated against if the scheme went ahead.

Following discussion of the issues raised, it was

**RESOLVED** that the proposal be supported.
