371. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs. S. L. Davies, T. Devichand and W. V. Thomas (Cllr. H. J. Evans deputising).

372. MEMBERS' DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr. S. N. Lewis declared a personal and prejudicial interest in minute no. 374, as she was a member of the Dafen Welfare Committee.

373. COMMUNITY FACILITIES – MAINTENANCE WORKS

RESOLVED that the report of the Technical and Burial Services Manager on work undertaken be noted.

374. DAFEN PARK – RECYCLING FACILITIES

Cllr. S. N. Lewis declared a personal and prejudicial interest in the following matter as she was a member of the Dafen Welfare Committee and left the meeting before discussion commenced.

The Clerk informed members that Cllr. A. J. Rogers had requested that this item be placed onto the agenda to inform members that a request had been received from Carmarthenshire County Council for the glass recycling facility to be relocated at Dafen Park.

A complaint had been received by Carmarthenshire County Council from a resident regarding the noise of the glass bottles being deposited into the recycling bins in the car park at Dafen Park. Carmarthenshire County Council had enquired if the recycling bins could be relocated to the centre of the car park. Relocating to the centre would reduce the noise disturbance to the resident and allow the collection vehicles to collect the recycling bins safely.

Members were informed that the Dafen Welfare Committee had recently met to discuss the proposed relocation of the recycling bins and voted that they be removed from the park. Email correspondence from the welfare committee to this effect was distributed with the agenda papers.

During discussion, the clerk informed members that this was a temporary relocation measure and the matter would be looked at again once the MUGA play development had been completed at Dafen Park with a view to a further relocation of the bins taking them further away from properties. It was suggested that the impact of this further measure be assessed at this juncture.

RESOLVED that request for the glass recycling bins to be relocated be agreed to and that a further review of the situation be performed once the MUGA development had been completed at the park.

375. CAPITAL PROJECTS

Members received the report of the Deputy Clerk inviting the committee to prioritise the capital projects that were identified at the meeting held on 13 February, 2019, to which minute no. 405 refers.

Members were reminded that £6,000 had been earmarked from the capital schemes budget of £71,000 towards the new play area at Trallwm (Minute No. 317 of the Council meeting held on 10 December, 2019 refers). Therefore, the remaining budget available for allocation was £65,000.
