I am writing on behalf of the Tywi Gateway Trust to ask if you would consider supporting our work through a donation from your S137 fund. Our charity, based at Parc yr Esgob (Bishop's Park) in Abergwili, is dedicated to preserving and enhancing this unique historic and natural space for the benefit of the Carmarthen community and beyond.

Founded in 2016, the Trust exists “to conserve, protect, restore, manage and maintain the park for the benefit of the public.” Parc yr Esgob, the former grounds of the palace of the Bishops of St Davids, is a registered historic park and garden, central to Carmarthen’s heritage and community life.

From 2018 to 2023, we led a successful £2.4 million restoration of the main park and gardens, funded largely by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. This included the creation of a new visitor centre and café, and has helped us grow annual visits to over 50,000.

We are now preparing for the final and most ambitious stage of restoration: the revival of the historic walled garden, including its 19th-century glasshouses, dipping pond, and gardener’s bothy. Our vision is to create a vibrant, multi-use community space that increases the park’s benefits for a wider, more diverse range of visitors.

Our work is deeply collaborative, and we are proud to partner with organisations such as Coleg Elidyr, NHS Social Prescribers, the Wallich, and local SEN units. These partnerships show first-hand the transformative health, educational, and social benefits of gardening, green space, and volunteering. This work was recently recognised with the prestigious King’s Award for Voluntary Service.

Parc yr Esgob is inclusive and fully accessible, making it especially popular with young families and individuals for whom more strenuous outdoor spaces can be a challenge. The park has also been awarded the Green Flag, the international benchmark for publicly accessible parks.

The park is home to nationally significant heritage and biodiversity, from county and national champion trees to habitats that include an oxbow lake, water meadows, woodlands, and formal gardens. We work closely with Carmarthenshire Museum, also based at the site, to offer a rich and meaningful visitor experience that integrates environment, history, and community.

While we have secured significant capital investment, our core work relies heavily on donations and the ongoing support of local stakeholders. As a small, community-led charity, we are constantly striving to maintain and build on the success of this local treasure.

We would be grateful if your council would consider making a donation from their S137 allocation to help us continue delivering this vital work. Your support would directly benefit the health, heritage, and well-being of countless Carmarthenshire residents.



I write on behalf of the above mentioned chess club that have 4 teams that play in the West Wales Chess League. We were formed in 1973 and we currently have about 25 adult members and 20 junior members whose ages range from 9 to 75.

Over the last few years, we have been consistently one of the most successful clubs in Wales and in 2023 we won the Welsh Club Championship and in 2024 our A team won the West Wales Chess League Division 1 and our C team won the West Wales Chess League Division 2. We also qualified to represent Wales at the European Club Championships in Serbia in October 2024.

In September 2025 supported by a National Lottery Grant, we launched the Carmarthenshire Chess Academy. The aim of the Academy was to support schools, colleges and community groups to host their own chess clubs. Since then, we have been reaching out to these different organisations and we now support chess clubs in 6 local primary schools and 3 local comprehensive schools. Each of these clubs has between 20 and 30 members. We also held the first ever Carmarthenshire Chess Academy festival in October 2025 at the Selwyn Samuel centre and we had over 75 local children attend to play competitive chess for the first time. We plan to hold further Academy events later in 2026.

We have utilized our national lottery grant to purchase additional equipment that we lend to these other clubs. To continue the growth of the Academy we are looking for additional sources of finance. As you will be aware, the costs involved in running clubs are continually increasing and our methods of funding are limited.
