3. LONG TERM IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The work programme is organised on a cyclical basis covering the summer and winter periods. In the summer period the majority of the time focusses on ground maintenance activities, whereas in the winter period the focus switches more to buildings' maintenance activities. Cemetery and Porterage activities are performed throughout the year.

The Council has put in place a preventative maintenance budget based on an annual list of priorities and to cater for day to day contingencies. By adopting a preventative approach this supports sustainable development principles. The cyclical annual maintenance programme ensures community assets are kept in good order, extending the life cycle of the assets over many years.

4. SUSTAINABILITY AND WELL-BEING CONSIDERATIONS

4.1 The Council's capital and revenue investment in the community facilities meets the following aims, core values and well-being goals.

SWISS VALLEY COMMUNITY CENTRE

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To consider essential maintenance works and proposed upgrades to Swiss Valley Community Centre.
- 1.2 To consider the allocation of ring-fenced funds for the community centre upgrades.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 This report sets out a programme of essential maintenance works at Swiss Valley Community Centre, including measures required to meet fire safety compliance standards. It also presents proposals for upgrading the facility, informed by recent maintenance and fire safety inspections, as well as consultation with local members, hirers and the Swiss Valley Community Centre Events and Activities Committee.
- 2.2 The purpose of these proposals is to ensure that the community centre remains safe, functional and welcoming for community use, while supporting simplified management, enhancing the long-term sustainability and encouraging community use of the facility (Minute 40: June 2025 refers).
- 2.3 Recent user and committee feedback included a range of suggestions to enhance the community centre, such as improving heating and insulation, providing accessible Wi-Fi, upgrading overall aesthetics, redecorating, adding bay markings in the car park and a new access system.
- Additional proposals included repurposing underused rooms for small group hire and improving community awareness of events by installing an outward-facing digital screen for community announcements, advertising of hiring activity and events.
- 2.5 For the financial year 2025–2026, the council has approved the following budgets for the operation, maintenance and management of the Swiss Valley Community Centre:

Replacement of internal doors	£1, 800
Boiler servicing & maintenance	£ 200
Fire extinguisher servicing	£ 110
Annual emergency lighting tests	£ 110

Funds held by the council transferred from the former management committee currently stand at £53,720.77.

3. ESSENTIAL WORK REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Some of the essential works are already underway or scheduled, being informed by maintenance inspections and independent fire safety risk assessments.

3.1.1 Electrical works

- Fit replacement 6-foot LED fitting in former committee room.
- Fit replacement 6-foot LED fitting in store room.
- Fit replacement 6-foot LED fitting in kitchen.
- Install new 2-gang switched socket outlet in former committee room and tidy cables.
- Install new emergency light in disabled toilet (from fire risk assessment).
- Install three toilet extractor fans.

Total cost - £1,284

3.1.2 Other essential works

- Repairs and adjustments to emergency exit doors £300
- Adjustments and replace insulation to front door £250
- Replace two internal door sets (from fire risk assessment) £8,000 (£1,800 already in LRC budget from fire risk assessment)
- Replace two internal fire doors £1,500 (from fire risk assessment)
- Replace two hall extractor fans £1,020
- Install Paxton door access system £1,902
- Install Broadband £949

Cost estimate - £12,121

4. PROPOSED WORKS

- 4.1 As noted in paragraph 2.1, the following proposals have been developed based on maintenance inspections and consultation with hirers and the Swiss Valley Community Centre Events and Activities Committee.
- 4.1.1 Convert the former amateur radio/store room into a new meeting space available for hire.
- 4.1.2 Repurpose the former committee room as a storage facility for regular hirers and to support Amateur Radio Club activities.
- 4.1.3 Improve accessibility to the community centre for users with mobility or other access requirements by installing a power assisted door.
- 4.1.4 Mark and delineate parking bays to improve car park organisation, safety and accessibility.
- 4.1.5 Upgrade community centre signage and information to improve accessibility.
- 4.1.6 Partner with Swiss Valley Primary School to host a branding competition, encouraging community engagement and displaying the winning design on the community centre.

- 4.1.7 Consider a digital information display viewable from outside the centre.
- 4.1.8 Redecorate the centre throughout to improve aesthetics and user experience.
- 4.1.9 Refurbish toilets; replace vanity unit, including sinks and related pipework ladies toilet and replace WC toilet pans and cisterns throughout.
- 4.1.10 Replace heavy tables and chairs with lightweight, foldable alternatives for ease of use and storage efficiency.
- 4.2 Furthermore, it is proposed to upgrade the heating system at the community centre to improve efficiency, safety and user comfort.
- 4.3 The current boiler location, relative to most hot water outlets, makes it challenging to meet water safety requirements. According to HSE guideline for taps and outlets: hot water should reach at least 50°C within 1 minute (60 seconds) of running the tap. For most outlets this isn't achievable.
- 4.4 The Council has a statutory duty to manage the risk of Legionella bacteria in water systems. Therefore it is proposed to install electrical point of use electrical water heaters to provide instant hot water in the toilet facilities.
- 4.5 The community centre is a large space to heat, and the existing system relies on a first generation combination boiler with steel radiators and a basic heating controller. The radiators are inefficient for heating such a large space and their positioning, along with the associated pipework and exposed valves, often results in accidental damage during hall activities.
- 4.6 It is proposed to remove the original steel radiators and pipework and install new energy-efficient fan convector heaters, mounted at high level to improve heating efficiency, reduce energy consumption and minimise the risk of damage during activities. (See Annex 1 for further details.)
- 4.7 It is also proposed to install zoned heating controls to provide independent controls for the main hall, meeting rooms, kitchen, foyer and toilets. The system will be internet-enabled, allowing remote monitoring and management for greater efficiency and responsiveness.

5. LONG TERM IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The proposed upgrades to heating, lighting, furniture and digital infrastructure will improve efficiency and reduce operational costs over time. Strategic investment in energy-efficient systems not only supports long-term sustainability but also demonstrates the council's commitment to environmental responsibility.
- 5.2 Maintaining the structure, efficiency and appearance of the community centre and its environs is critical to sustaining community engagement and maximising usage. Targeted investment will help safeguard and improve revenue streams, preserve the centre's reputation, and ensure it remains competitive and relevant in meeting the evolving needs of residents and local groups. This approach also positions the centre as a long-term community hub for inclusion, wellbeing and civic pride.

Good afternoon,

I write on behalf of Felinfoel AFC regarding the football pitch located at Felinfoel Recreation Grounds.

The football club propose to erect a spectator barrier surrounding the pitch and seek the required permission and/or guidance from the appropriate authorities. Felinfoel AFC propose the barrier will be funded by the club and/or donators to be erected by private contractor/s.

The barrier would remain the property of Felinfoel AFC and maintained as such. Alternatively, Felinfoel AFC may consider donating the equipment to the rural council if they feel that their maintenance of the structure would be preferable.

The barrier would afford pitch access for maintenance vehicles and the lower section would be removable to ensure the Cricket facilities are unaffected during the summer season.

A spectator barrier surrounding the pitch would offer the club, Spectators and council multiple benefits, for example:

- \sim discourages dog walkers from entering the playing areas and leaving dog faeces which is presenting a risk to our players, junior and senior alike
- ~ maintains respectable and safe spectator distance for junior and senior players alike
- ~maintains respectable and safe spectator distance to support respect of referees
- ~ discourages unauthorised use of the grounds and prevents issues as seen last season by other groups
- ~ supports the clubs longer term goals of enhanced FAW accreditation which in turn will enable us to expand the club's offering I.e increase age group offering
- ~supports the respect strategies of the football governing authorities
- ~may provide opportunity for sponsorship displays increasing revenue intake to the club and support the clubs strategic direction.

We would appreciate your advice and guidance on this proposal at your convenience.



Written Submission to the Recreation and Welfare Committee – Parc Elin Mair Cricket Safety Concerns

Overview

We are residents of Clos Clement, a housing development completed in 2022 by Enzo Homes that directly borders Parc Elin Mair in Five Roads. We are submitting this statement in relation to the use of the park for organised hard-ball cricket matches, which has created a repeated and serious risk to both property and personal safety due to the proximity of the cricket pitch to our home.

We are not opposed to recreational sport in the village, and we recognise the longstanding presence of the cricket team. However, we believe the current use of the pitch for formal cricket matches — in its present layout and without physical safety measures — is unsafe, unmanaged, and legally risky for all parties involved, including the Council.

Key Concerns

- 1. Proximity of the Pitch to Residential Properties
 - The wicket is located approximately **35 metres** from our boundary and around **40 metres** from the gable end of our home.
 - This is, according to Council-provided figures, the closest residential proximity of any pitch managed by Llanelli Rural Council and well below the guidelines set out by the ECB for minimum boundary distances.
- 2. Documented Safety Incidents
 - Cricket balls have entered our property on multiple occasions, including:
 - One instance of roof tile damage to our front porch. (See appendix 1 showing damage, height and distance it would have had to have been hit assuming nearest wicket)
 - Multiple occasions of balls landing in our front and back garden while we or our children were present.
 - Multiple incidents of the ball hitting the gable end of the property
 - One incident where a ball landed on our balcony (See appendix 2 showing balcony, somehow not hitting the glass balustrading surrounding the perimeter)
 - One incident where a ball very nearly struck the homeowner while mowing the lawn.
 (See appendix 3 showing where ball landed in garden)
 - One match where four balls entered our property, in one evening
 - A couple of occasions where balls have been struck over our property and into next doors garden, No.6 Clos Clement – (see appendix 4 - showing distance)
 - One occasion where the opposition fielder spoke to the homeowner and stated "it must be a nightmare for you living here, its not even a half swing to get it over here"
 - These incidents have been reported and acknowledged by the Council.
 - I have included a list of known incidents under Appendix 5.
- 3. Lack of Physical Mitigation
 - The risk assessment carried out by the club recognises the risk and identifies ball-stop netting as a possible mitigation, yet no physical safety measures have been implemented.

- The current position appears to rely entirely on:
 - o "Self-managed" bowling direction by the team,
 - Match reports submitted by the club themselves,
 - And social media posts for fixture notifications with no central council-managed communication to residents.
- These are unenforceable and inadequate safeguards against risk of injury or further property damage.

4. Trespassing and Safety Breaches

- There have also been instances where children have entered our property without permission to retrieve balls, climbing fences or being sent over by adults involved in the game. On at least one occasion, a child was unable to climb back over the fence, and had to be let out via our garden gate.
- This not only raises further safety concerns but also raises legal and safeguarding issues, particularly if any child were to be injured while trespassing.

5. Insurance and Liability

- We are aware that the cricket club holds public liability insurance via Insure4Sport. However, the insurer has confirmed that while cover is in place, policyholders must exercise "due care and diligence" and ensure the area is "safe to play."
- Given the repeated incidents, known proximity to homes, and absence of netting, it is entirely
 unclear whether any future claim for personal injury or property damage would be
 accepted under these conditions. If the club or council were found to have failed to take
 "reasonable steps to prevent injury or damage," cover could be denied, exposing both parties
 to legal and financial liability.

Legal and Planning Context

- We acknowledge the concept of "coming to a nuisance" has been raised by the Council.
- However, this does not absolve parties of responsibility when:
 - o A foreseeable risk is documented,
 - o Incidents have occurred,
 - o And reasonable mitigation could be implemented (e.g. netting).
- We note that no physical mitigation was required during the planning or approval of the Clos Clement development, which is unfortunate and now leaves residents and the Council exposed.

Our Request to the Committee

We ask the Recreation and Welfare Committee to:

- 1. **Formally recognise** the safety risk posed by the current use of the cricket pitch at Parc Elin Mair;
- 2. **Prioritise funding or co-funding** for the installation of 6+ metre ball-stop netting along the boundary with Clos Clement;
- 3. Require the cricket club to provide written confirmation from its insurer that full site-specific disclosure has been made (including the 35m boundary and history of incidents), and that cover remains valid under these conditions;
- 4. Require a formal and centralised communication process for all fixtures (league and non-league) to be provided directly to affected residents not left to social media posts by the club;
- 5. Consider whether continued hard-ball cricket matches on this site should be paused or restricted if no physical mitigation is introduced.


Closing

We are fully supportive of community sport and do not wish to restrict recreational use of public space unnecessarily. However, the risk at Parc Elin Mair is now documented, repeated, and avoidable. Continued inaction exposes both residents and the Council to unacceptable risk.


We appreciate the Committee's time and hope this matter will be treated with the seriousness it warrants.

Appendix 1 – Front Porch Damage and Showing Height Required and Distance (45m)




<u>Appendix 2 – Balcony</u>

To set out PRGDC's position on this, we entered into the application on the basis that it was to be funded through DCC and Sports Council.

As a committee we have different priorities currently in respect of both leisure and recreation. Improving the meeting spaces to encourage further community use, and developing an artificial surface which would help preserve the grass pitches through the winter by e.g. shifting training and other sports on to them top our priority list.

There was concern expressed at the committee that this Be Active application might prejudice a future PRGDC bid. But ultimately we resolved to support Dafen's application. Hello Chris and thank you for this. I just wanted to acknowledge receipt of your communication and to confirm that it will be tabled for consideration at the next Recreation and Welfare Committee meeting, to be held on 16 September 2025.

In the meantime, could you please state what financial contribution is being sought from the council – thanks.

Furthermore, Officers are more than happy to hold an initial discussion with you and PRGDC representatives in anticipation of the request being considered in September. I think this will be helpful. I will ask my colleague Gareth and or Graham to get in touch with you about this when Gareth returns from leave. Both Gareth and Graham have been included in this reply to facilitate this.

I should mention, that if the council ultimately agrees to support your request; it has no surplus funds to contribute towards a new artificial wicket in the current financial year because we've set the budget several months ago. Therefore, any agreement to provide financial support would have to be held in abeyance and possibly carried forward into next year's budget, which starts on 1 April 2026. I just wanted to make you aware of this, as potentially it may impact when PRGDC looks to submit any grant request to the Sports Wales' Be active Fund, should the council agree to help fund some of the shortfall.

The artificial wicket they play on there is very worn and in need of replacement

We have been working with Pwll Recreation Ground Development Committee to seek funds for this. An initial expression of interest has been submitted by PRGDC to Sport Wales' Be Active Wales Fund for funding for this purpose. This will only provide a maximum of 50% funding for a replacement artificial wicket. the total cost is £15-18,000 so a significant shortfall will remain even if the application is successful.

I hope that Llanelli Rural Council can see how this would benefit the health and wellbeing of local people and improve the civic amenities on offer in Pwll. In the light of that, would the council provide some additional financial support to allow this project to succeed?

I'd be very happy to discuss this further with your self of other members of the council.
