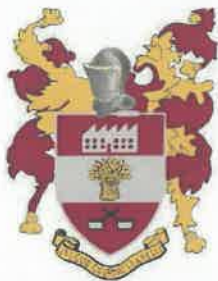

Health Service Matters – Summary for Members

1. Welsh Ambulance Services University NHS Trust – Hywel Dda Clinical Services Plan

Correspondence dated: 25 August 2026

From: Emma Wood, Chief Executive, Welsh Ambulance Services University NHS Trust

Subject: Ambulance capacity and transport implications arising from Hywel Dda University Health Board's Clinical Services Plan.

WAST confirms that it is an active partner in Hywel Dda UHB's Clinical Services Plan and wider *A Healthier Mid and West Wales* transformation programme. Its role is to ensure that the impact of proposed service changes on emergency ambulances, non-emergency patient transport, workforce, fleet and overall capacity is identified and properly modelled as plans develop.

WAST representatives are involved in the relevant programme and project groups and contributed to the stroke-services consultation, including the Llanelli event on 15 June 2026. Initial work has included high-level population and travel-time modelling.

Key point for members: detailed modelling has **not yet been completed**. WAST therefore cannot currently give definitive answers on the full ambulance and transport impact of the proposals. Further modelling and scenario planning will consider journey times, transfers, emergency and non-emergency demand, workforce, fleet and additional capacity requirements.

WAST has suggested that a meeting with the Council would be more useful **at a later stage**, once this work has produced a more evidence-based position.

Specific areas being assessed

Ambulance capacity and resilience: modelling will examine the effect on emergency and non-emergency provision, including inter-hospital transfers, specialist transfers and patient discharge. Any additional resource requirements will be discussed with the Health Board and Joint Commissioning Committee.

Stroke services: WAST will model the proposed acute stroke "treat and transfer" arrangements, including journey times, transfer activity and operational capacity. Existing thrombectomy pathways to Cardiff and Bristol are separately funded and are not currently expected to change.

Patient transport and accessibility: WAST acknowledges concerns about longer travel distances and will assess the resulting impact on non-emergency patient transport demand, vehicle utilisation and capacity.

Implementation assurance: WAST states that operational readiness, risks, dependencies and mitigations will be assessed jointly with Hywel Dda UHB before service changes are implemented

Suggested Council position: Note the response, maintain the Council's concerns regarding ambulance capacity and patient transport, and request a further meeting with WAST once the detailed modelling and scenario planning are available.

2. Hywel Dda UHB – Adult Mental Health Section 136 Place of Safety

Engagement period: 1 September–26 October 2026

Hywel Dda University Health Board is seeking views on the future location of its **adult Section 136 Place of Safety service**.

Section 136 of the Mental Health Act allows police officers to take a person experiencing a mental-health crisis in a public place to a designated place of safety for assessment and appropriate support. Hywel Dda UHB has a statutory responsibility to provide this service.

Following a multi-agency options appraisal, the Health Board's **preferred option** is a dedicated Section 136 suite at:

Cwm Seren, St David's Park, Carmarthen.

Five possible models were assessed. The preferred option was selected because the appraisal concluded that it would offer the **safest, most clinically effective and sustainable model of care**.

The Health Board identifies potential benefits including:

- immediate access to specialist mental-health support;
- improved management of acute risk;
- better access to physical-healthcare services where required; and
- a dedicated facility intended to address environmental and staffing challenges at existing sites.

The review has involved partners including **Dyfed-Powys Police, local authorities, West Wales Action for Mental Health and Llais**.

Issues members may wish to consider

For Llanelli and surrounding communities, the principal issue may be the effect of centralising the adult Place of Safety provision in **Carmarthen**, particularly in relation to:

- travel distance and accessibility;
- impact on families and carers;
- police transport and police officer time;
- ambulance involvement where required;
- equality impacts for people without private transport;
- continuity of care after assessment; and
- whether the advantages of a dedicated specialist facility outweigh the consequences of greater geographical centralisation.

This is a **separate issue from the Clinical Services Plan correspondence above**, although both raise broader questions around access to health services across the Hywel Dda area.

Consultation deadline: Monday 26 October 2026.

Responses can be submitted through the Health Board's *Have Your Say* consultation portal. Paper copies are also available through the Health Board Communications Hub.

Suggested Council position: Members may wish to consider whether Llanelli Rural Council should submit a formal consultation response, particularly focusing on accessibility, transport implications, geographical equity and the impact on service users and carers from the Llanelli area.

Suggested resolutions

The Council could resolve to:

1. **Note** WAST's response and request a further meeting once detailed ambulance modelling is complete.
2. **Note** Hywel Dda UHB's Section 136 Place of Safety consultation and preferred Carmarthen option.
3. **Consider submitting a Council response** to the Section 136 consultation before 26 October 2026, focusing on accessibility and transport implications for residents in the Llanelli area.

Thank you for your letter regarding the Clinical Services Plan proposals put forward by Hywel Dda University Health Board, highlighting the potential implications for the Welsh Ambulance Service in relation to ambulance capacity and hospital transport arrangements for communities across Llanelli and the wider region.

We recognise the important role of the ambulance service in keeping communities safe and supporting patients to access care across the Health Board area.

I am pleased to confirm that the ambulance service continues to be a key stakeholder and active partner working closely with HDUHB across the breadth of its strategic service change agenda and, in particular, supporting the early planning on the development of the proposals put forward in the Clinical Services Plan.

A key element of our ongoing engagement is to work closely with the health board to ensure that the implications of future service changes for WAST are identified, modelled and fully considered as plans develop. This includes the potential impact on core services, including 999 emergency

ambulance provision and non-emergency patient transport services, together with any associated workforce, fleet or capacity requirements.

Where modelling identifies a need for additional ambulance capacity or other resources to support planned service changes, this will inform further discussion with the health board and the Joint Commissioning Committee through the appropriate commissioning arrangements.

I would like to fully assure the council that we have been actively involved in this work and have summarised below some of this work to date:

- WAST representatives have been core members of programme and project groups supporting the Clinical Services Plan and the wider *A Healthier Mid and West Wales* clinical transformation programme.
- Colleagues from our operational, clinical and planning teams have contributed to public consultation activity relating to the proposed changes to stroke services, including the Llanelli consultation event on 15th June 2026. This has provided an important opportunity to hear directly from members of the public about their concerns regarding ambulance provision, patient transport and access to services.
- We have also worked closely with the health board to support early analysis of the proposals, including high-level population and travel time modelling to inform the initial stages of the programme.

As you will appreciate, the health board is progressing this work through a structured process to develop and assess the future service options. WAST has provided input and advice throughout, including consideration of the potential implications for our core services. Further work is now required with the health board to develop the evidence base, including more detailed ambulance modelling and scenario planning to understand the operational and transport implications of the proposals within the Clinical Services Plan and to identify any associated capacity or resource requirements.

At this stage, and before that analysis has been completed, we are not yet in a position to provide definitive answers to all of the detailed questions raised in your letter. I do, however, recognise the importance of the issues you have highlighted and can assure you that they will form part of our ongoing work with the health board as the proposals develop.

Given the further analysis still required, I believe a meeting with the council would be more valuable at a later stage, when we are able to provide a more informed and evidence-based position. In the meantime, I have set out a high-level response to the key areas raised in your letter at Appendix 1 overleaf. I hope this provides helpful assurance on our current position and the work that remains underway.

Appendix 1:

1. Ambulance Capacity, Demand and Operational Resilience

Detailed ambulance modelling will be undertaken in support of the Clinical Services Plan to quantify the potential impact on both emergency and non-emergency ambulance provision. This will include consideration of the effect on core service delivery across the health board footprint, together with any additional requirements arising from inter-hospital transfers, specialist transfers and patient discharge.

The modelling will help identify any operational, workforce, fleet or capacity implications associated with the proposed service changes. Where additional capacity or resource requirements are identified, these will inform further discussions with the health board and the Joint Commissioning Committee through the appropriate commissioning arrangements.

2. Stroke Services and Phase 2 Consultation

Detailed modelling and scenario planning will be undertaken to assess the ambulance implications of the proposed model for acute stroke care across Hywel Dda. This will include the travel and transport requirements associated with the proposed 'treat and transfer' model, including any changes to journey times, transfer activity and operational capacity.

Access to specialist thrombectomy services in Cardiff and Bristol is already provided through established, separately funded pathways. As the Clinical Services Plan does not change thrombectomy provision, eligibility or referral arrangements, no additional thrombectomy transport activity is currently anticipated. The modelling will determine whether the wider changes to acute stroke pathways create any additional ambulance resource requirements to support safe and timely patient care.

3. Patient Transport, Accessibility and Equality

Non-emergency patient transport is an important part of the patient pathway, and we recognise the concerns raised by residents through the public consultation process. We will assess the potential impact of the Clinical Services Plan on future non-emergency demand, including the effect of longer journey distances for some patients accessing planned care.

This will help identify any changes in activity, vehicle utilisation and capacity that may be required to support the proposed service model. We have already highlighted this as an area requiring further consideration with the health board. As part of our mixed transport model, we will also continue to work with other transport providers to support eligible patients in accessing healthcare services.

4. Governance, Assurance and Implementation Readiness

We continually review our escalation and resilience arrangements as part of routine operational planning, including preparations for periods of increased system pressure. Alongside this, detailed modelling will be undertaken to strengthen the evidence base and assess the potential impact of the Clinical Services Plan on our core services, including any additional capacity or resource requirements.

A key part of this work will be to assess operational readiness jointly with the health board, ensuring that identified risks, dependencies and mitigations are understood and addressed before any service changes are implemented.

Share your view on the adult mental health place of safety

Hywel Dda University Health Board is engaging on the future location of its adult Section 136 Place of Safety service. The engagement runs from 1 September to 26 October, 2026.

Section 136 of the Mental Health Act allows police officers to take a person experiencing a mental health crisis in a public place to a designated place of safety, where they can receive an assessment and appropriate support. The Health Board has a statutory responsibility to provide this service.

A multi-agency options appraisal has identified a dedicated Section 136 suite at Cwm Seren at St David's Park, Carmarthen, as the preferred option for future adult provision.

The proposal follows a review of existing facilities, which highlighted environmental and staffing challenges across a number of sites, and extensive work with partners including Dyfed-Powys Police, local authorities, West Wales Action for Mental Health (WWAMH) and Llais.

The engagement will seek views from staff, service users, carers, partner organisations and local communities on the preferred option and its potential impacts.

The preferred option was identified following an assessment of five possible models. The appraisal concluded that a dedicated facility at Cwm Seren would provide the safest, most clinically effective and sustainable model of care.

This would offer immediate access to specialist mental health support, improved management of acute risk, and better access to physical healthcare services when required.

We would like to understand how this change will impact patients and are inviting you to share your views by completing the questionnaire by Monday 26 October, 2026.
